The Bible

We believe that the bible, both the Old and the New Testament, is the infallible living word of God and we must follow its commands since it contains God's perfect law. (2 Timothy 3:16, 2 Peter 1:20-21, Deuteronomy 11:8-20)

We believe that the Bible contains all that is necessary to lead people to a knowledge of salvation and to live a righteous life. We believe it to be the ultimate authority in all matters of faith and Christian living. (2 Timothy 3:16)

Jesus Christ

We firmly believe that Jesus Christ is the God of the Old Testament and New Testament (John 1:1-5 & John 5:19)

We believe that Jesus showed hope and grace to those who needed it most (John 4:4-26)

We believe that Jesus showed truth and justice in the face of unpopular opinion (Psalm 146: 7-9, Matthew 8:1-4)

We believe that Jesus wanted to reach everyone regardless of their political positions, biases, upbringings and identities. Jesus is for everyone and He wants everyone to live rightly and justly under his Lordship. Jesus is the only person that can truly transform someone's life therefore it is our goal to bring people into His presence and into a relationship with Jesus. (1 Corinthians 12:12-14, 2 Corinthians 5:20-21)

We believe that Jesus is the divine Son of the Trinitarian God, the only sacrifice for our sin, and our guarantee of God's never-changing love for us. (Luke 24:49) We believe that He died, rose again, and is now seated at the right hand of God. We believe that one day He will return to the earth to receive all those who have believed in Him. (John 1:29, Romans 3:25)

Eternal Life

We believe that people are eternal beings and will spend the rest of eternity after their life on earth either with God in eternal happiness (heaven) or without God in eternal sorrow (hell). (Revelation 21:8, Matthew 25:46) We believe that through faith in Jesus, we are granted an eternity with God in heaven. (Acts 16:30-31, John 5:24)

The Holy Spirit

We believe that God, the Father, still speaks to His children today through His Holy Spirit. We believe that the Holy Spirit will always agree with God's Word, and teach us to live according to it. (John 14:26) We believe that the Holy Spirit gives us strength to share the love of Jesus Christ with others and that all who are willing are able to receive the anointing of the Holy Spirit.

(Romans 8:26). We know that the Holy Spirit empowers His people by Spirit Baptism. Evidence of this event is found in many spiritual gifts or signs including the sign of speaking in tongues. These gifts or signs come from God. These Spiritual Gifts are given to us by God as evidence of Holy Spirit work. (Acts 1:5, Ephesians 5:18, Matthew 28:19)

God's Hope In a Broken World

We believe that Jesus has promised to return to Earth signifying the end of the age. We look to this as a hope for believers to be reunited with Jesus in physical form once again. Only God knows when this time will occur. (Matthew 24:36, Hebrews 9:28, Matthew 24:1-51, Revelation 22:12)

(Matthew 28:19, Mark 16:16) It is our job, as the community of Jesus, to show people the truth and grace of Jesus. (Hebrews 10:25, James 5:14, 1 Peter 2:9)

We must not look like the world however we must love the world in both truth and grace. (Romans 1:18-32, Romans 2: 1-11) People cannot be transformed without the power of Jesus so it is our job to introduce Jesus to them through our actions, ministries, outreach and gatherings. This is why everyone is welcome into our community so that we may walk alongside them so that they will become transformed by Jesus. (2 Corinthians 5: 20-21, 2 Corinthians 6:14)
